a. Fresno County 2023/ 2024 RMRA Overlay. The County of Fresno has notified MCWD that an overlay project is planned within MCWD. The streets include Chestnut Avenue, Bagley Avenue and Recreation Avenue. The County has requested information associated with water and sewer utilities within the planned overlay area.

Recommended Action: Direct staff to proceed with submitting the information regarding water and sewer facilities in the project limits. Prepare a draft letter for MCWD to review

requesting that the cost of protecting and raising manholes and water valves is included in the cost of the project. The letter would request that the cost of work associated with the existing manholes and water valves is separated to distinct bid items in the event that MCWD would be responsible for the costs.

Board consensus to direct Micheal Taylor to prepare and submit letter to the County of Fresno.

b. Development on Central near Peach; Site Plan Review 8357 – 4001 E Central Avenue. The County of Fresno forwarded a Site Plan Review to MCWD for review and comment. The County requested comments by January 12, 2024. A draft response is attached for review and comment.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> Review the draft response and direct staff to submit a final response to the County of Fresno prior to January 12, 2024.

The attachment for item 5.a. was labeled as 6.a. by mistake. Consensus of the board is to submit a final response to the County of Fresno.

6. New Business:

a. **Baseball Field Use.** Don Munoz visited the MCWD office to inquire about the use of the baseball field Friday's and Sundays for 2 hours beginning this January. The Fowler Redcat Baseball Team is comprised of Fowler and Malaga students.

Recommended action: Board's pleasure.

Board consensus was to move forward with the contract with Don Munoz. The board needs clarification on the times of baseball field use and if there is going to be any maintenance needed before the team begins practice.

b. **SPR 8357, 4001 E. Central Avenue.** Fresno County Public Works has submitted the Site Plan Review for comments; due by January 12, 2024.

<u>Recommended action:</u> For review by the board and potential addition of comments for submittal to Fresno County Public Works.

c. Security Cameras. Security cameras have been installed at the district office, park and water shop on a trial basis. This trial will expire on January 12, 2024. Two quotes from Monarch and two quotes from Howard Technology Solutions have been provided for security camera and professional monitoring services with the option to finance at 0% interest. Please note that the Monarch includes an end-of-year discount, which is extended until January 31, 2024.

h. Well 5A and the Tank at the Well 5A site. The two projects are funded by ARPA and administered by the County of Fresno. The two projects are intended to be constructed together and a bid opening was conducted on January 4, 2024. The construction bid for the well portion exceeds the grant awarded to MCWD. MCWD had requested additional funds from the County of Fresno in the past, with the expectation that the current construction costs would exceed the existing grant. A draft letter is attached for MCWD Board review and edits. The draft letter would be submitted to the County of Fresno to request additional grant funds, which would allow for award of the projects. The construction bid for the tank portion was within the available grant funds.

<u>Recommended Action:</u> Review the draft letter and direct staff to submit to the County of Fresno with any appropriate edits.

If acceptable, it is suggested that this letter is forwarded to the County of Fresno and the applicant on behalf of Malaga County Water District. The following are comments concerning the subject application:

- A deposit of \$1,000 is required by the MCWD to initiate the review and comment efforts for the proposed development. The applicant will be invoiced for any costs incurred by the MCWD beyond the initial deposit.
- 2. The project is a proposed building metal building measuring 60'x175' located on the corner where S. Maple Ave. transitions into S. Bagley Ave. The project also includes site improvements such as a trash enclosure, parking lot improvements and landscaping.
- 3. The property is within the boundary of the MCWD and is subject to MCWD requirements associated with water and sewer services.
- 4. There is an existing 8-inch water main located in S. Bagley Ave. fronting the subject property. There is an existing 10-inch sewer main in S. Maple Ave. and proceeds to cross State Route 99 and is adjacent to the subject property.
- 5. The application indicates that the water demand for this facility is 100 gallons per day (gpd). Please provide information in determining this demand. Provide proposed points of connection to the water system and show locations of existing water mains in S. Maple Ave. and S. Bagley Ave. on proposed site plan.
- 6. The application is silent on sewer service needs. It is expected with the use of the building that a sewer service will be needed for the project. Please provide proposed points of connection to the sewer main and show location of existing sewer main in S. Maple Ave. on proposed site plan.
- 7. The site will require a Non-Residential Waste Discharge Permit for sewer service. The site may require pretreatment facilities in accordance with current ordinances. The applicant must submit an application for a Non-Residential Waste Discharge Permit prior determination of the requirements that may be necessary to meet the regulatory requirements of the Malaga County Water District. Specific information regarding all waste streams that are planned for the site will

- be required for review. Review and approval of the information and the applicant's proposed pretreatment facilities will be required prior to allowing the development to proceed.
- 8. The proposed development would be required to submit an application for service and follow the steps outlined in the Malaga County Water District development checklist to obtain the required permits and services. The application will require a site plan with definition of on-site and off-site utilities. Water service connections shall be in accordance with MCWD Standards. The applicant may obtain a copy of the checklist from the District Office at 3580 S. Frank Street, Fresno, CA 93725.
- 9. The developer shall be responsible for constructing any improvements to the District's sewer and water system in accordance with District requirements and standards. The applicant must submit utility plans that clearly identify the location of water, sewer, landscaping facilities, and drainage areas.
- 10. MCWD facilities shall be protected and accessible at all times.
- 11. Storm water shall not be discharged to the sanitary sewer system.
- 12. Fees associated with District review of construction of improvements shall be determined upon receipt of the plans for construction and an engineer's opinion of probable construction cost for the water and sewer improvements.
- 13. The applicant is responsible to determine if there are requirements of the fire department.
