## item 14.a.1

I am writing to invite you to attend Rio Bravo Fresno's celebration of the Sixth Annual National Bioenergy Day. We will be marking the occasion, along with dozens of other facilities across the country, with a barbeque lunch followed by a short presentation and a facility tour at 11:30am on Wednesday, October 24<sup>th</sup>. We would be honored if you would attend to celebrate bioenergy and the role it plays in reducing emissions in our area.

Rio Bravo Fresno is located in the heart of California's agricultural region in the community of Malaga. This Biomass-fired electrical generating facility is rated at 24.3MW net and operates continuously at full load. Rio Bravo Fresno makes enough renewable "green" power for Approx. 20,000 local homes.

"Bioenergy" refers to an industry whose companies produce electricity and heat generated from wood and other organic materials. In addition to serving as a domestic energy source, these industries work closely together to keep American forests healthy and put organic byproducts like tree trimmings, construction and demolition byproducts and agricultural residuals to good use.

Bioenergy is a sustainable, renewable, and carbon-friendly energy source for many reasons.

- First, the wood used to produce electricity at a biomass facility has no other use. If not used to produce bioenergy, this wood might be open burned, which releases criteria pollutants (methane, PM, CO, and NOx into the air. Or, it might be left to decompose a process that also releases methane.
- Second, the use of organic materials to produce energy does not introduce new carbon into the atmosphere, unlike the use of fossil fuels for energy.
- Third, bioenergy is a key part of sustainably managed forests and farms. It is necessary to remove organic residues and non-merchantable wood in order to keep a forest healthy and growing. Rather than discarding or open burning the removed wood products, bioenergy provides a good, productive use for them.
- Fourth, bioenergy diverts tons of used wood from urban sources away from landfills thus increasing landfill capacity and preventing that wood from decomposing-a process which produces methane.

We hope you will be able to join us on October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018, to learn more about bioenergy and see our facility, which employs 25 Local Residents and produces enough power for Approx. 20,000 local homes and businesses. 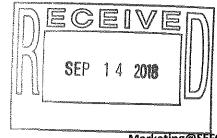

Re: No Paid Property/Liability Claims in 2017-18

Dear Mr. Garabedian Jr.:

This letter is to formally acknowledge the dedicated efforts of the Malaga County Water District's Governing Body, management and staff towards proactive risk management and loss prevention training. Your agency's efforts have resulted in no "paid" property/liability claims for program year 2017-18. A "paid" claim for the purposes of this recognition represents the first payment on an open claim during the prior program year and excludes property claims. This is a great accomplishment!

It is through the efforts of members such as Malaga County Water District that SDRMA has been able to continue providing affordable property/liability coverage to over 505 public agencies throughout California. In fact, 428 members or 85% in the property/liability program had no "paid" claims in program year 2017-18.

In addition to this annual recognition, members with no "paid" claims during 2017-18 earned 2 credit incentive points (CIPs) thereby reducing their annual contribution amount. Also, members with no "paid" claims for at least 3 consecutive program years may receive a lower "risk factor" which also reduces their annual contribution amount.

As SDRMA is dedicated to serving its members and preventing claims, we would appreciate your agency taking a moment and sharing with us what made your District successful in preventing property/liability losses. Our goal is to incorporate your successful ideas and suggestions into our loss prevention programs to benefit all members of SDRMA.
