We're Increasing Our Contamination Monitoring: What to Expect

We'll soon be increasing our presence in residential neighborhoods and commercial areas throughout Fresno County.

What Are We Doing?

Our staff will be walking routes to look for two key issues:

- Contamination (items placed in the wrong bin)
- Overfilled carts and bins that could impact collection or create safety concerns

Why?

This is part of our broader effort to reduce landfill waste and improve how recyclable and compostable materials are handled in our region.

Our main focus is education. We want to help residents and businesses:

- Understand what belongs in each bin
- Improve sorting habits
- Meet state recycling rules like SB 1383 and AB 341

When we stop by, we may leave helpful notices and resources when needed, and our team will be clearly identifiable with IWS or Caglia Environmental gear. We will never enter private property.

The Ultimate Goal:

Contaminated or overloaded containers can slow down collection, damage equipment, or cause otherwise recyclable items to be sent to the landfill. With your help, we can:

- Reduce contamination
- Boost recycling and composting rates
- Keep our neighborhoods cleaner and more sustainable
