Subject: Award of contract for Well No. 6 VFD to Lighthouse Electric

CDBG Project No. 16451

BACKGROUND

The District received a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) in the amount of \$250,000, for the installation of a variable frequency drive (VFD) unit at Well No. 6. The VFD will adjust the speed of the pump motor based on the water system pressure. When the pressure falls, the motor speeds up to pump more water and when the pressure increases, the motor slows down to pump less water. Currently Well 6 has only an "on" or "off" setting. The VFD will better control the system pressure and save energy by decreasing the number of motor starts. The project will also install a new electric motor at the well.

On January 18, 2018 the District received bid proposals for Well No. 6 VFD that were much higher than the engineer's estimate. The County of Fresno did not approve the value engineering efforts to reduce the cost of the bid. Your board was forced to reject all of the bids and re-bid the project.

On June 5, 2018 the District received three bid proposals for the revised specifications as follows:

1.	Lighthouse Electric, Fresno, CA	\$227,231
2.	Converse Construction, Redding, CA	\$243,430
3.	Telstar Industries, Hanford, CA	\$314,208

The revised Engineer's Estimate was \$240,000.

DISCUSSION

The revised budget for the project is \$297,200 for construction and engineering costs and a contingency of \$16,000. The District would be required to provide a match of \$47,200.

The re-bids have been approved by Fresno County Community Development Depart due to the CDBG funding.

RECOMMENDATION

We recommend that the District adopt the attached resolution awarding the contract for Well No. 6 Variable Frequency Drive to Lighthouse Electric, Inc. in the amount of \$227,195
