### Public Workshop for Local Limits

“Local Limits” are the limits for pollutants in wastewater that all commercial and industrial wastewater dischargers must comply with. The Malaga County Water District’s Pretreatment Program has completed a Local Limits study in order to obtain scientifically-based discharge limits. Pursuant to federal pretreatment regulations in the Clean Water Act, the District is conducting a **public workshop on November 7, 2016 at 6 P.M. at the District Office** to receive public comment on these new limits prior to their official adoption into the Pretreatment Program.

If your facility discharges non-domestic type wastewater into the sewer, these new limits may potentially impact you. Non-domestic wastewater, or industrial discharge, is wastewater that is not characteristic of what would typically be discharged from a residential household. Examples of non-domestic type wastewater include truck wash-down, water that has been mixed with chemicals, or water that has been used in a commercial process prior to discharge into the sewer.

The District will provide an informative presentation about local limits and the MCWD Pretreatment Program. We would like to hear your questions, comments, and concerns regarding these new limits. If you are unsure or think your facility may be discharging something that is not in compliance with permit regulations, please contact the MCWD Environmental Compliance Inspector, Thomas Siphongsay, who will assist you.
